Stage 2 recently experienced a local heritage walk and tour of Hurstville Museum. As part of this Term's History unit on 'Community and Remembrance', students learnt about their local area and how it has changed over the last 200 years.



The excursion included an interactive session comparing school life in the present and the past and an exploration of a range of handmade and recycled toys and games.



Students finished their day with a walking tour through Hurstville's oldest and busiest thoroughfare, where there are a blend of old and new buildings.
