Dear Parents/ Carers,

Today your child expressed an interest in joining the school Training Band. No previous musical training or ability is required. They just need a desire to learn and participate in the fun and the challenge that being part of a school band brings.

Our Band Director, Murray Bishop will help your child choose a suitable instrument. Factors influencing his/her choice of instrument include the instrumental balance of the band and the physical suitability of the instrument to the student. Please let us know if your child already has an instrument. This happens beginning Term 1, 2024.

If you and your child decide to join training band, the following commitment will be required:

- Band Rehearsal: Monday 8:00-9:00 am in the Desert Pea Hub on Level 1. (Start date to be advised)
- Weekly Small Group Tutorials (40 mins): during school hours on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday
- <u>Band fees:</u> \$170 every term which equates to \$680 for the year
- **\$50 per term -** instrument hire (if required) which equates to a total of **\$200** for the year The cost includes group tutorials (regardless of the number of weeks in the term)
- **Band fees are non-refundable** as the school employs specialist music teachers on behalf of band members. You will receive an invoice once lessons commence.
- Participation in performances

The band requires a one-year commitment which means that if your child commits to the program, it will cost a minimum of \$680 for the year. Please discuss this with your child before applying to join. This commitment allows your child time to develop instrumental skills, learn to read music and co-ordinate these skills when playing in the band with others. 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Benefits of Learning Music

Your child would like to take up this opportunity to learn how to play a musical instrument and play in a band.

Children in primary school years are at their optimum age to begin musical understanding and learning, which is quite different to any other skill.

Benefits of joining the Penshurst PS Training Band

- Learning to play a musical instrument
- Learning to read a musical score
- Developing skills of musicianship
- Playing in a group which provides cooperative and social experiences
- Performing in a group which helps reduce performance anxiety
- Other benefits of having a musical education are listed below.

Scientists, musicians, educational and health experts over the last century have discovered a multitude of valuable and helpful benefits that come with intentional music lessons and rehearsing (which is quite different to singing along with the radio.)

Proven by science and research, the benefits of playing music include:

- Music training helps the brain significantly with other higher functions such as mathematics and permanently wires this enhanced performance
- Learning about timing and rhythm helps other coordination such as in sport
- Music is an artistic outlet that assists emotional development and expression
- Discipline, perseverance, dependability, composure, courage and pride in results
- US studies have shown that, regardless of socio-economic status or school, students who participate in highquality music programs perform up to 20% better on English and standard maths exams
- Primary aged children who are involved in music lessons show greater brain development and memory within a year than children who receive no musical training
- Children who are involved in school music improve in all areas of their study, work better in teams, have enhanced critical thinking skills, stay in school, lower truancy and drug use in high school and pursue further education
